



Walk/Bike to School is back!

Please read these rules to keep everyone safe.

- Wear masks while in groups, even though you are outdoor.
- NO MORE THAN 10 people per walk/bike group. Once there are 10 people on site, the group will need to move forward and maintain social distance from the other groups.
- At least one adult must be present in each group to serve as a chaperone, and each adult counts as one person toward the 10 person group limit.
- Two SPD police officers will be on site to assist with traffic.
- THS Staff will be at school to welcome students inside.
- Arrival at school should be timed between 8:00-8:30am.
- No lingering or socializing on school grounds for adults who accompanied their children after drop off.


